# "What Are the Greatest Attributes of Our Democracy"

What makes the perfect government?

government? For the entirety of civilized human history, societies have tried to answer this question. Direct democracy sprouted early on in Athens but was unable to amass enough power and lands to withstand the Romans, whose representative democracy was miles ahead of its time until its lack of constitution allowed popular leaders to transform the popular leaders to transform the government to a dictatorship. The notion of a constitution first arose in 1215, when King John signed the Magna Carta, a novel idea that sparked the first Enlightenment. It was during this Enlightenment era that thirteen British colonies successfully staged a revolution against Great Britain with the goal of creating the closest thing to a perfect government they could.

The first draft of a new American government became the Articles of Confederation. The Articles were the spawn of a nation extremely fearful of central power; under the Articles, the Federal Government could not levy taxes, declare war, regulate trade, or create any foreign policies without the agreement of each and every state. Less than ten years after its enactment, a rebellion in Massachusetts, Shay Rebellion, exposed the extreme danger of the weak, clunky government formed by the Articles. As a response the Shay Rebellion, delegates from all thirteen states met in 1787 for a second try. In this second draft, the Founding Fathers looked back on historic mistakes second draft, the Founding Fathers looked back on historic mistakes. They separated the legislative, executive, and judicial branches to spread power equally and prevent a repeat of the Romans. They created a government that could respond efficiently to any issues, countering the problems of the Articles. They improved the voting system, creating a electoral college to prevent an overload of votes system, creating a electoral college to prevent an overload of votes and giving the nation an ability to expand, a power that Ancient Athens never had. Combined, these political inventions formed the most advanced political system the world had ever seen. So, with all these ingenious solutions, a small article hidden in the middle of this revolutionary document is of this revolutionary document is easily overlooked.

Consisting of only one paragraph, the fifth Article of the Constitution is simple and unremarkable. When two-thirds of Congress agree to propose an Amendment to the Constitution, and that amendment is ratified by three-quarters of State legislatures, the Amendment is treated as an addition to the Constitution. Unless the amendment removes the representation of an unconsenting state of levies a tax on any state.

Straightforward, Uncomplicated. Yet it is quite possible the most incredible and farsighted article in the entire Constitution. All civilizations make mistakes. The Song Dynasty neglected its military. The French monarchy abused their absolute power. A state ability to learn from A state ability to learn from these mistakes is what makes these mistakes is what makes a civilization successful. After the Mongols invaded the Song Chinese, Zhu Yuanzhang found the Ming dynasty, which focused more on their military to prevent future invasion. Following the French Revolution and the rise of Napoleon Bonaparte, those of Napoleon Bonaparte, those at the forefront of the Bourbon Restoration made the clear choice to become a constitutional monarchy instead of restoring the absolute monarchy that caused the revolution.

It is obvious to the human mind to correct known errors. The genius of the Fifth Article comes in the fact that it allows for the correction of unknown errors. In 1787, very few knew that, eventually, women's suffrage would become a national movement. Thanks to the Fifth Article, a woman's right to vote came into being with almost no conflict whatsoever. In 1787, a poll tax seemed so similar to British rule that the founding fathers did not even consider that it would eventually have to be banned, but when the necessity arose, Congress simply had to pass the 24th amendment. The Fifth article provided Abraham Lincoln with movement. Thanks to the Fifth 24th amendment. The Fifth article provided Abraham Lincoln with a stable, established platform to abolish slavery that allowed him to focus on merely convincing a Republic to abolish it instead of having to restructure the entire government. Both the French and Chinese underwent large, bloody affairs before seeing any change. Conversely, the U.S. has amended itself 27 times 247 years, only descending into national conflict once.

The U.S. has endured two and a half centuries of the most turbulent times in history, witnessing some of the most drastic social, political, of the most drastic social, political, economic, technological, and military changes humanity has ever seen. The reason we have been able to do this, to survive through a civil war, through not one but two world wars, through a Great Depression, through the invention of the most destructive weapon even known, is our nation's adaptability. We have seen many challenges. There are issues we are still tackling. And we will face new threats. But because of our nation's fluidity, we will overcome anything the world will overcome anything the world can throw at us, and like so many before us, we will continue to strive towards a perfect government.

This time of year is always exciting with the hol-idays recently past, family get-togethers, parties and finally some time for rest. The daylight hours are now

getting longer each day to allow us to once again reflect why we belong to the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Our mission is to foster camaraderie among United States Veterans of overseas conflicts, to serve our Veterans, the military and our communities. We are to advocate on behalf of all veterans. To be honest, the most common words heard as I travel the state is: "we need more new members to do the work". How then are we to promote patriotism, honor military service, serve our communities, and finally, ensure the care of veterans and their families?

The state of the Department of Colorado in my opinion is healthy and robust. Look at all the Community Service Reports for all the good work so many Posts and Auxiliaries are doing continuously. Look at the membership reports to see how those same posts are growing and working hard to in-crease our ranks. This VFW administra-tive year is now half over and already our Department is at 92.58% member-ship. The goal of course is 1020/ ship. The goal of course is 102%. This is excellent work by so many working not

only for the Department goal but their individual Post and District goals. As of this writing, we have 9 Districts over 90% and 4 Districts over 95% membership. District 5 is the present membership leader sitting at 95.22%. The Posts in the state are strong with 3 posts in the 70% and 22 posts in the 80% range. We have 10 posts over 100% and 51 in the 90% range. Leader today is at 108.10% and that honor goes to Post 8898 in Boone. Can our Department get to 102% in the next 5 months?

If you want to leave a lega-cy for your VFW Post, go to your Quartermaster and ask them if you can make phone calls to help get your unpaid members up to date with their dues. Don't lose your post membership base. Be a worthy comrade and call a buddy to the next meeting. Your post may have members serving overseas in the military. You can pay their dues with your relief fund. You may have elderly or physically impaired members who can't get into your meeting. They too should have their membership paid from your relief fund. Stay in touch with them in person and by phone.

I am sure everyone has heard by now, one of the By-Law changes at the National level several years ago, was to do away with the dues reserve at the Post level. This is a good thing. Now the quarterly audits won't be coming back to the Posts that forget how and what it was. If you report a dues reserve, you should probably stop since it is not required and will save on some book work.

Speaking of quarterly audits, we are seeing a new trend. Signatures. The Quartermasters Manual on the National web site states the Trustees and Commander must sign the audit report. The Quartermasters name may be typed in, but the Trustees and Commander must sign. We are getting more and more audits without the Commanders signature. Please take the time to read

the material explaining how the audits are done, or call Headquarters and ask for a copy of how to fill out an audit. Because of the current Covid climate, a separate signature page may be used as long as the audit was viewed by the trustees and Commander.

The By-Laws are very BONDS. clear on this. Each officer that is ac-countable for funds must have a surety bond equal to the amount of liquid assets. This is normally the Quartermaster. Surety bonds are like an insurance policy paid for by the Post saying the Quartermaster will not steal from the Post. This is why we try and make sure the audits are done correctly. The bonding company requires the audits be done correctly in case a loss occurs. Believe me, it has happened in the past.

# GENERAL ORDERS NO. 3 Echemory 1 2024 2023-2024 Please remind all Posts that you MUST be 102% to qualify for All State. Deadline is June 30, 2024. <u>Entry forms</u> will be e-mailed to all that qualify.

**1. As prescribed** by Sec 217 & Sec 221 of the National Congressional Charter By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, Nominations of Post Officers shall open in March and remain open until the Post is ready to vote, provided, however, that when a poll system is used, as hereinafter described, nominations must be closed at the meeting prior to the election to allow the Adjutant to prepare a printed ballot. Post officers shall be elected in April. (a) The officers of each Post will consist of a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Adjutant, Chaplain, Judge Advocate, Surgeon and three (3) Trustees

(b) The Post shall elect the Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, and three trustees.

(c) The Appointed officers of each Post shall consist of at least an Adjutant, Chaplain, Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Officer of the Day, Service Officer and Guard to be appointed as prescribed in Section 216 in the Manual of Procedure.

2. Proof of Eligibility Requirements for Officers: All Posts, Districts and Department should be reminded of the provisions of Sec. 215 (Post), 415 (District), and 515 (Department) of the National Congressional Charter By-Laws and Manual or procedure that officers, elected and appointed, shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until such proof of eligibility has been submitted to the respective Commander and Adjutant for review.

**3. Registration for the VFW National Convention:** Each Post will pay, in ad-vance, a national registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall en-title the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the national convention will pay a ten-dollar (\$10) delegate fee, in accordance with the requirements of Sec 222 (d) of the National Congressional By-Laws. <u>Delegate fees should be sent di-</u> rectly to the Quartermaster General at National Headquarters.

4. Attention is directed to Sec. 213 of the National Congressional Charter By-Laws concerning arrearages of Posts for National, Department, or District Dues, National Convention registration, poppy money, supply money or other financial obligations, or failure to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703 of the National By-Laws, or failure to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit or Post Election Reports. Posts that are delinquent in any of the aforementioned shall be deprived of all representation in County Council meetings, District, Department and National Conventions.

5. Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Sec. 218 (a)(11), Manual of Procedure, Duty of Trustees. Trustees Report of Audit must be completed by the Trustees, in detail, at the close of each quarter, one of which ends March 31st. Commanders are reminded that all funds are to be under the custody and control of the Post Quartermaster. Persons other than the Post Quartermaster who may handle Post funds, such as club manager, bingo chairman, or committee chairmen are responsible to the Post Quartermaster to maintain accurate records and accounts and should be properly bonded. Post Trustees are to ensure that the financial records of these special funds are also audited in the same manner as the other accounts of the Post Quartermaster.

6. Commanders on all levels should begin organizing their 2024 Memorial Day Buddy Poppy Campaign. To qualify for Post All American, VFW Posts must purchase Three per member in the Post.

7. All-State Commanders and Quartermasters. Entry forms for All-State Commanders and Quartermasters will be e-mailed to all qualified persons by July 3, 2024 Posts and Districts must be 102% in membership by June 30, 2024, advanced one Voice of Democracy and one Patriot's Pen winner to the next higher authority, and made a donation to the Department Service Office in order for the Commanders to be eligible for this award. Post and District Quartermasters will be eligible if their Post/District achieves 102% in member-ship by **June 30**, **2024**. The entry form must be submitted to State Headquarters by suspense date provided on the notification letter. All State Teams will be pre-sented at the August 2024 COA meeting during the Joint Opening.

**8.** Council of Administration meet-ing will be March 17, 2024 at John S. Stewart VFW Post #1, 8:30 AM for Joint Meeting. Workshops will be on March 16. 2024.

9. State Convention is scheduled for June 05 through June 08, 2024, hosted by Department of Colorado VFW. Information will be posted on the Department of Colorado Web Page. (www.vfwco.org)

10. The Department of Colorado Veterans of Foreign Wars Loyalty Day Parade will be in Calhan, CO., Saturday May 4, 2024 10:00 AM line-up time.

11. Applications for the Department State Convention Site for <u>2025</u> can be obtained by contacting State Qm. Bruce Dolan, 1400 Carr St., Lakewood, CO. 80214, (303) 421-1630. A check for \$300.00 deposit must accompany the bid application.

#### **IMPORTANT! - No Credential and Delegate Cards Will be Mailed**

Please note that the Department HQ will not print and mail paper convention credentials for Delegates, Post Commanders, District Commanders, and State Officers. Instead, all Post, District, and State Officers will be identified with official VFW and Department rosters and Post Adjutant's or Quartermasters are asked to report the Post's elected delegates via the Department website. Credentials will then be "stamped" on the individuals name badge when they register at the convention.

Under Section 222 of the Manual of Procedures, "Delegates and alternates for the District Convention and Meetings, Department and National Conventions shall be elected at a regular meeting in April." Posts are entitled to 1 delegate for every 30 members or fraction thereof based on the number of members in good standing as of March 31st. The Department Headquarters will notify each post in writing what their delegate strength is along with the delegate registration fee which must be paid no later than 15 days before the convening of the Department Convention.

The on-line delegate report form will be available starting 1 April through the day before the convention opening date.

## 13th Annual VFW Holiday Airlift Spreads Festive Cheer Across Colorado

Englewood, Colorado played host to the heartwarming 13th Annual VFW Holiday Airlift, a collaborative endeavor spearheaded by the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Colorado, VFW Post 9644, and the Colorado Aviation Business Association (CABA). Over the weekends of December 10th and 17th, 2023, this remarkable event saw thirty-two aircraft take flight from Signature Flight Support South at Centennial Airport (APA) to transport an impressive 10,000 pounds of food and toys to 12 airports, primarily located in smaller or rural communities throughout Colorado.

The Holiday Airlift initiative, which runs year-round, accepts monetary donations for food, shifting its focus to physical donations of food and toys as Thanksgiving approaches. The journey commenced on Friday, December 8th, 2023, as dedicated volunteers purchased food and toys from local supermarkets and deliver to a hangar at Centennial Airport in Englewood, Colorado. On December 9th, volunteers diligently weighed and palletized the donated goods, preparing them for distribution to the 12 cities scheduled to receive assistance through this airlift.

Mother Nature threw a curveball on December 10th, with high winds affecting some of the aircraft's delivery plans. Nevertheless, approximately half of the food was successfully distributed, primarily to areas along the front range of the Rocky Mountains. Finally, on December 17th, the remaining aircraft completed their deliveries.

The donated goods made their way to destinations such as Grand Junction, Montrose, Durango, Cortez, Alamosa, Pueblo, Las Animas, Sterling, Greeley, Northern Colorado Regional, Longmont, and Lafayette, spanning both the western and eastern sides of the mountains. At these locations, VFW volunteers welcomed the aircraft, assisting with unloading and, in many cases, providing lunch and discounted fuel to the generous pilots who contributed their time and resources to the cause.

This year's Holiday Airlift is projected to benefit 25-30 VFW Posts, which, in turn, will serve over 1,600 veterans in need and their families, ensuring they have a special holiday season.

The mission was made possible thanks to the dedication of nearly 100 volunteers, including pilots and ground support teams. Among these volunteers were members of the Precision and Aerobatic Flight Teams of Metropolitan State University of Denver, alongside commercial, corporate, and private pilots from the Front Range region of Colorado. All participants generously donated their time and covered aircraft expenses to make this charitable event a success. A wide variety of aircraft were utilized for the Airlift, including a Varga Kachina, a Glasair GlaStar, Cessna 172s and 182s, a Lancair 360, Piper Cherokees, Cirusses, Beechcraft Bonanzas, and a Pilatus PC-12.

Since its inception in 2011, the CABA-VFW Holiday Airlift has delivered a total of more than 90,000 pounds of food and toys, benefiting approximately 12,000 veterans and their family members. Beyond its significant impact on veterans during the holiday season, this initiative exemplifies the vital role of light aircraft in delivering essential supplies to rural areas and underserved communities, highlighting the remarkable spirit of the general aviation community when called upon to assist others.



Please make arrangements to get these items to the March COA in Denver or sooner if you can. We will ensure the safety of your items.

Lastly, I am so happy to announce that the long-promised Suicide Awareness and Prevention Resource is available and on our Colorado website for all Auxiliary members to download either to their phone or to print and distribute to membership. It is located right under my picture on the webpage and is the result of over 2 years of work and coordination with other partner Veterans Service and Support Agencies and the Colorado Office of Suicide Prevention. Please take some time to look this over, to download, and to make a central part of your efforts this year. Do not hesitate to contact me directly if I can assist you in any way making this resource work for you.

All General Orders from the Department President are official and must be read at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference.

1. The Department of Colorado VFW Auxiliary Parade of Programs, Workshops, and Council of Administration meeting is scheduled for March 16-17, 2024, at John S. Stewart Post #1, 841 Santa Fe Dr. Denver, CO 80204. A complete schedule of programs and workshops will be available on the Department website. A Joint Council of Administration meeting to be held on Sunday, March 17, 2024, and the Auxiliary Council meeting will follow. Please watch for further details coming out soon.

2. Department President Phil Reinpold's special project is Operation Veteran Strong. Please forward all donations to Department Treasurer, Lennie Dolan.

3. Members in Good Standing are those who are life members or those who hold a 2024 annual membership card as of January 1, 2024. A member who is not in good standing is not eligible to attend meetings, vote, or hold an office or chairmanship. They are also not eligible for a cancer grant from National. All rights and benefits are restored immediately upon payment of the current year's dues. Proof of payment may include a paper or digital copy from MÅLTA.

4. Membership: Members who have not yet paid their dues for 2024 are requested to send dues to your Auxiliary Treasurer or pay them directly through the MALTA system with an activated account. Membership cards will be sent to paid annual members from National Headquarters within 2 to 4 weeks. Members should always carry an application to recruit new members. The VFW Auxiliary may fix an admission fee. This entitles each new member to a membership pin, a copy of the current Podium Edition Bylaws and Ritual or have the choice to access behind the MALTA login. (See Section 102 of the Bylaws)

5. Audits for the months of October, November and December 2023 were to be completed by January 31, 2024. Audits must be read on the Auxiliary floor and voted to be approved before sending them to the Department Treasurer by February 28, 2024.

6. District Presidents: Annual official visits to the Auxiliaries should continue only as it is possible to do that safely for all. A copy of the visitation report

#### **February 1, 2024**

is to be sent to the Department President and Department Chief of Staff. District Officer making the visit should sign the Secretary and Treasurer books to verify that they are being kept in accordance with procedures. Copies of bonds, audits, and verification of 990 filings should be available for review. All questions on the visit form should be completed.

7. Voice of Democracy and Patriots Pen: The Department VFW Auxiliary would like to extend its congratulations to all the winners throughout the state and to thank all Auxiliaries for their hard work to promote these programs.

8. Hospitalized Veterans will receive special recognition during the week of February 12 through 16, 2024. Consider planning a special event or activity to honor our hospitalized veterans during this time.

9. Salute to Service nominations from the Auxiliaries are due to VFW Department Headquarters by March 15, 2024. There will not be an annual Department Award Banquet this year. Awards will be forwarded to the Districts to be presented at a District meeting to the members to be recognized. Forms are available on the Department website.

10. Program Report Forms should be filed with the VFW Department Headquarters in a timely manner so that Auxiliaries will receive credit for their hard work. The reporting year is April 1, 2023, to March 31, 2024. All reports are due to Department Headquarters by April 15, 2024.

11. Supplementary Report Forms should be completed by all Auxiliaries and sent to Department Secretary Cindy Anderson by the April 15, 2024 deadline. This form provides program information that is not included on the program reporting website but is needed by the Department Chairman for year end reporting to National. The form can be found on the Department website in the Program Book and under Forms and Documents.

12. A special thank you to all of those that attended the Parade of Programs in Durango. The Program Chairmen did an outstanding job of promoting their programs and I am sure that each of you were able to take some good information back to your Auxiliaries.

#### **President's Special Project** "Operation Veteran Strong"

#### Greetings!

The holidays are over and I know our Auxiliaries have been very active supporting our Veterans during the holi-days. Let's get more involved and support President Phil's special project Operation Veteran Strong in the remain-ing months of the 2023/2024 year The holidays were tough for me af-

ter losing a special friend by suicide just before the holidays last year and then our community lost a police officer just before Thanksgiving in the line of duty. The police officer was also a Veteran. I found myself reaching out to Phil's Special Project, Operation Veteran Strong, for help, and they were very helpful. For anyone who has ex-perienced a suicide of a friend or family member, it is traumatic. This great organization also has help and resources for family members who are seeking resources to combat the many questions suicide leaves behind.

As a nation, we are losing our Veterans by Suicide at an average of 22 a day. This includes Veterans that are just returning home and can't cope with returning to civilian life and our World War II, Korean and Vietnam Veterans. Operation Veteran Strong has free help for them and their families.

Operation Veteran Strong is a Colorado based non-profit set up as a useful tool just for U.S. Veterans navigating civilian life. They (and you) can find inspiring stories from other Veterans, information on accessing benefits, helpful self-assessments, and a wide range of free, innovative and practical support services. This help to our Veterans is 100% FREE and confidential

Here, at Operation Veteran Strong, Veterans get the tools they need to get things done. With their free, confidential account, they can connect on their own terms with: Veteran benefits, VSO contacts, outdoor recreation, employment, financial support, education, family and spouse supports, vet groups, VFW's, community support, and so much more. And most importantly both medical and non-medicalized solutions for Veterans returning to civilian life. They also specialize in mental health programs and help with Suicide Awareness

President Phil's special project pin

is a beautiful purple and teal ribbon pin, with the Auxiliary emblem in the middle. The pin's colors are from the suicide prevention ribbon. They signify hope and courage for those who have attempted suicide and remembrance for those who lost their battle. They truly represent Phil's special project that is dear and true to him – Suicide Awareness by proving "WE VALUE EVERY VETERAN."

My main focus is ensuring every Post and Auxiliary member purchase a special project pin. The proceeds from these pins goes towards Phil's special project. The money that is raised this year will go to help our military and veterans in their time of need. Currently there are 28 Auxiliaries that HAVE NOT purchased any pins. I will be sending letters to those Auxiliaries within the next couple of weeks.

You can order these beautiful pins by mailing an order (located in this Veteran) along with the monies to pay for the requested number of pins. Once I receive the order form, I will send your requested number of pins to you via USPS. The cost per pin is \$3 and you are allowed to resell the pins for \$3. If you resell the pins at a higher cost, you are required to send the extra monies into Department of Colorado VFW Auxiliary. All monies raised from this pin are to go to Operation Veteran Strong.

Do you all know that we have 5,292 Auxiliary members in the state of Colorado, not counting At Large membership. I am challenging EACH AND EVERY Auxiliary member to give \$12 (a dollar a month) to support Operation Veteran Strong. My small Auxiliary has 60 members – that would equal \$720!! If every member met my challenge, we could make **\$63,504** for our Veterans!! Just imagine how much we could donate if we all just gave up one coke or one coffee a month! Your \$12 a year challenge money can be sent directly to Department Treasurer Lennie Dolan, just mark in the memo line that is for the \$12 challenge for Phil's Special Project. I hope to see you all at the COA's


